









TERRE's TREES

Common Name: Neem

Scientific Name: Azadirachta Indica

It's a tropical or semitropical species native to Indian subcontinent.

Ecology:

- It is a drought resistant tree and thrives best in the areas having sub-arid or sub-humid conditions and well-drained deep and sandy soil.
- Annual 400 mm 1200 mm of rainfall is needed for the growth. It can also grow in regions with rainfall less than 400 mm. However, it largely consumes groundwater, drastically lowering the level.
- The optimum annual mean temperature between 21–32 °C is required and can withstand temperatures as high as 50°C but cannot withstand temperatures below 4°C.

- It can tolerate a high level of pollution and can recover even if most of its foliage is dropped.
- It is most suitable for checking urban pollution. [Refer NEER]]
- Neem has relatively high efficiency of CO2fixation and provides a shield against pollutants such as SO2.

Uses & Benefits:

- Many people from southern India use tender shoots and flowers of neem as vegetable in their diet.
- Neem has extensive medicinal use for skin diseases and is anthelmintic, antifungal, antidiabetic, antibacterial, antiviral, contraceptive, and sedative.
