Girgaon cha Raja - Green Footsteps



A very old tradition which was started by Lokmanya Tilak is still a strongly celebrated religious festival called "Ganesh Utsav" in India. The purpose behind starting this festival was to bring people together to share ideas and thoughts in old times. 


